### PROCEEDINGS

The forty-seventh Annual Meeting of the Society was held in the Devotion House on May 24, 1948 at 8 P. M. President Blanchard presided, and some thirty members were present.

Annual Reports were received from the Committee on Rooms, the Treasurer, the President, all of which were duly accepted.

Brief reports were received from Miss Bush and Miss Lee on the meeting of the Bay State Historical League held in April.

Nominations for the following new members were received, and all were duly elected Mrs. Joseph A. Hall, Mrs. Parker Hayden, and Mrs. Charles W. Ward.

The Nominating Committee reported names for the Treasurer, Clerk, and Trustees, and they were duly elected. The other officers and the committees were elected at a subsequent meeting of the Board of Trustees.)

The President announced the signing of a lease between the Town and the Society for our use and our responsibility in connection with the Edward Devotion House.

Mr. Dana stated that the bronze tablet erected at the Goddard farm by the Hannah Goddard Chapter D. A. R. was now owned by Dr. James M. Faulkner and that he did not care to deed it to the Town.

The President introduced Mr. Charles S. Tapley, President of the Danvers Historical Society and Vice President of the Bay State Historical League, who gave a scholarly account of "John Hancock, Boston Business Man." This was followed by a discussion and light refreshments.

The resignations of Mr. Earl E. Davidson, Mr. Woodworth James, Dr. and Mrs. A. William Reggio, Rev. Harold Bend Sedgwick, and Miss Mary E. Williams have been received with regret, and during the past year, in accordance with the By-Laws, two resignations have been considered accepted because of non-payment of dues for two consecutive years.

The Society held two meetings in 1947. On Sunday afternoon, February 16th, some fifty-five members gathered, I had almost said crowded together for our 46th Annual Meeting in this room. The customary business was transacted, but when, at the conclusion of his report as President, Dr. Denny announced his desire not to stand for re-election through the incoming Board of Trustees, a spontaneous and hearty vote of thanks for his many years of service to the Society was passed. Dr. Harold Bowditch then clearly explained the elements and variations in "Early New England Paintings of Coats of Arms," illustrated his talk with full-color slides which enhanced appreciation of the styles of the different artists. He also commented on coats of arms owned by Mr. Oliver and Miss Little brought to the meeting, and answered a number of questions raised by his interested listeners.

About fifty members accepted the invitation to the garden-party meeting at the home of Mr and Mrs. Bertram K. Little, on Wednesday afternoon, May 28th. Reports of recent meetings of the Bay State Historical League were heard from Miss Bush, Miss Fish and Miss Lee, our delegates to the League, the latter suggesting that this Society should entertain the League at some future meeting. Mrs. Little's discussion of "The Nine Devotion Family Portraits painted by Winthrop Chandler" showed members something of the detective ability needed to follow the clues latent in seemingly unrelated source material and the satisfaction to be found in having the pieces of any family's story fit together through the perusal of letters, newspapers, wills, inventories and other public documents.

Your Trustees have carried on the business of the Society largely through telephonic conference and small committee meetings this past twelve months. They have shaped plans for three meetings during the coming twelve and I hope that any members having helpful suggestions for programs, or who would be willing to take part in the Society's activities, will not fail to contact one of the trustees.

**REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON ROOMS****MAY 24, 1948**

I am glad to be able to report that the Town has done a good deal of very much needed work on the house during this past year. The custodians have always been troubled by the large amount of dust which came up into the house from the cellar. This has now been eliminated by plastering the under side of the ceiling boards in the cellar, and the furnace has been converted from coal to oil which adds greatly to the comfort of the occupants.

The kitchen has been greatly improved by the installation of new cabinets, a new sink, and a much larger hot water heater. The floor also was repaired and new linoleum laid. Linoleum was also laid in the bathroom and a shower installed.

Owing to repairing of the plaster in the front hall it became necessary to re-paper the stairway, although this had been done by the Society quite recently. Wallpapers were chosen by your chairman for the front hall and for the front bedroom, which is open to the public, and both have been entirely done over. We hope you will all go upstairs and see the bedroom which we think is a credit to the house. At the same time the Town re-papered the chamber over the buttry, and that on the third floor. The roof has been insulated by the Johns-Manville Co.

The Town has eventual plans for the outside of the property, which include grading the area near the house and hanging a suitable sign to identify the house as open to the public.

On November 13, 1947 the Joanna Aspinwall Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution held their annual fall meeting in the house, and the arrival of William Dawes was celebrated with the usual ceremonies on April 19th. We have welcomed a few visitors during the year, but feel that an attractive sign and a set admission charge would both be beneficial to the successful operation of the house.

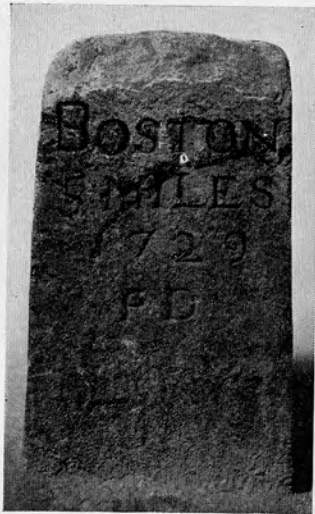


## MILESTONES AND TABLETS

## MILESTONES

1. Milestone on grounds of the Harvard Church, Harvard Street. The initials P D. refer to Paul Dudley, who placed many milestones in and around Boston. He was Chief Justice of Massachusetts beginning 1745. It is reported that this stone was removed some years ago when the street was widened, and that Mr Edward W Baker found it in the Town dump and had it rescued and set up near its original location.

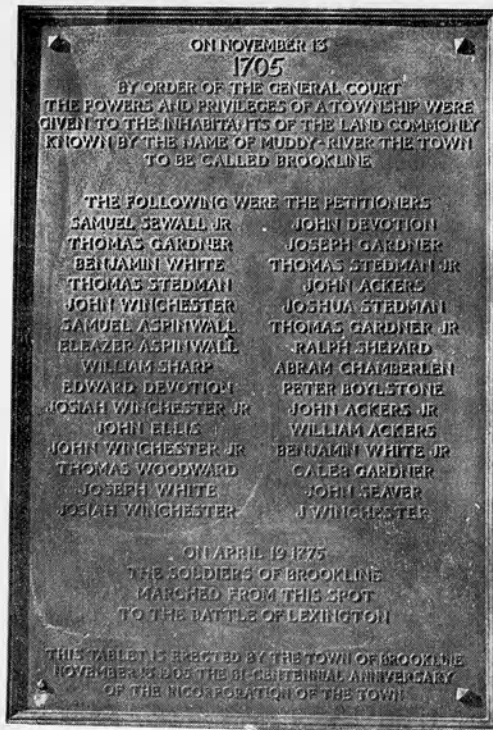
## TABLETS
